Policy 33. Conflict of Interest

A conflict of interest is any situation in which a person's personal (including relational, financial, business etc.) interest may reasonably influence the person's ability to make a decision in accordance with the person's duty to act in the best interest of DMHA. In order to avoid compromising the integrity of the decision-making process, any executive or committee member with a real or reasonably perceived conflict of interest or bias must declare it, and that person must remove themselves from the relevant decision-making process. If there is a question about whether a conflict of interest exists or might be reasonably perceived in relation to a committee or executive member involved in any decision-making process, the executive shall be notified of the question, and the question shall be reviewed and decided by the executive.
